- 1) Uzziah was a godly king, for the most part (2 Chronicles 26) . . . and certainly a gem among the vast “rogues gallery” of Israeli Kings. He had reigned for over fifty years, and his departure left a nation stunned. Talk about a time when you found yourself heartbroken and asking “how did I/we get to this place?” What helped you to move on? If you’re still in that place, what do you think it will take.
- 2) Isaiah saw that God was still on the throne even though it seemed like all was lost in his eyes. Why is it so hard, even for believers, to grasp onto this fact?
- 3) Compare verse three with Revelation 4:8 keeping in mind that these creatures were made almost exclusively for worship, what does this tell you about the worship God desires?
- 4) When Isaiah saw the worship that was taking place around the throne, he joined in as sincerely as he could. Because he did this, he was lifted out of the depression he was in. What part in worship does confession play? Do you praise the Lord when you are depressed? Why do you think this is so hard?
- 5) In the end of these verses, God takes a man filled with despair and sets him on the path to greatness. What person, place or thing in your life would you like for God to do this with? What plans will you make to put this into action?
